








Dedication





This year we are dedicating the annual to a man more than worthy of this honor. Mr. V. E. Ward has been a teacher since 1920 and has spent most of his teaching years at White

Pigeon High School.

Mr. Ward obtained his Bachelor of Science degree at Michigan State University and in 1920, started his teaching career at Colon. He was superintendant of Colon Schools at this time and taught agriculture and English while he was there. In 1925 he moved to Marcellus where he was also superintendant. He taught economics and English while at Marcellus. In 1932 Mr. Ward moved to district seven as a rural school teacher, and in 1934 to Quaker Street School, now consolidated with Constantine.


In 1935, Mr. Ward had his first teaching experience at White Pigeon. He taught English and biology in his first years and was high school principal from 1943 to 1946. In 1946 he

left White Pigeon to be director of Camp Maranantha in Muskegon, Michigan.

Mr. Ward came back to White Pigeon in 1953 and has remained here to the present time. He has taught English, biology, general business, science, and agriculture during his years here. This year Mr. Ward is retiring after 26 years at White Pigeon. He has taught many of our parents, and not only do we remember him for his teaching but as a devout Christian. His leadership in the Hi-Y is known throughout the state, and his free checkroom service as an activity of the Hi-Y has served countless thousands of people. We can never hope to pay back all that Mr. Ward has given us, nor would he want us to. But to give him a small part of the recognition that he truly deserves, we dedicate the annual to him on this, his retiring year. Thank You, Mr. Ward.


Freshman Basketball

Statistically Bill Slack was the leading scorer with an average of 13 points per game and John Davidson was the outstanding rebounder for the season.


