






























An eventful year to remember . . .

By the way, I like W.P.H.S. better than any German school, I ever attended. And the teachers here are as great as the kids. Especially I enjoyed the basketball season. No doubt that our team is the best of the whole U.S.! I sure will miss these sport activities in Germany. One of the things I enjoyed doing in America was, of course, my trip to Florida. But I never will forget Youth Legislature in Lansing, either. It was really fun. I enjoyed country life here very much, although I come from a city.

Thanks to the students and teachers at W.P.H.S. who helped making my year in America a wonderful one, an experience I'll never forget. I'll miss all my friends here, when I am back in Germany. Good luck for your future to all of you. And I'll miss America, too, a land I got to love and to admire. A land where you really can be proud to live in.



Cross Country



We feel prepared for the coming years, Achievement and success will be our fate; The knowledge we've gained has diminished our fears And made us confident that fine careers we rate.






























An eventful year to remember . . .

- 4. Disillusion begins to wither the ranks of hippies as the selfstyled "love generation" is degraded by drugs and disease.
- 5. Miss America 1969 is Judith Anne Ford from the state of Illinois.
- 6. A historic space venture was the moon-orbit flight of Apollo 8 by astronauts James Lovell, William Anders, and Frank Borman.
- 7. The war in Vietnam against international communism became the longest conflict ever fought by United States military forces.
