We cannot change human nature by edict, or by law, or by handouts. Character, said Christ, is

a personal assignment. Our country and age needs us as young people to go in and pitch for what is right.

Tomorrow, fellow graduates, is the first day of the rest of our lives. It is also the day we start making our dreams come true. Let us make it an adventure. Let us be willing to soar. We have the potential to be the nucleus of tomorrow's leadership.

Thank you Mom and Dad. Thank you other parents, friends, and faculty for giving us our headstart on the hilltop climb. Our adventure in leadership has begun with your solid foundation. To my fellow graduates, it is my hope that we will all crest "High on the Hilltop" in whatever field of work we choose and that we will see life as an adventure. To my grandfather, a special thank you for the visions and challenges offered by you those years ago. We, the class of 1983, accept your challenge for the coming adventure of out lives.

Well, here we are, already to leave and go our sepapate ways, but let's keep in touch. Good-bye.


