
Ask any band member, and they will tell you that marching band is not as easy as it looks. The whole band gives ideas on a theme for the following year's show. They listen to the music on tape, then vote for their choice. This is where band camp comes in. Band camp is one week of intense musical training. All members are to arrive at the school at 8:00 a.m. They all receive drill books, which contain field coordinates for each person for each movement. 


