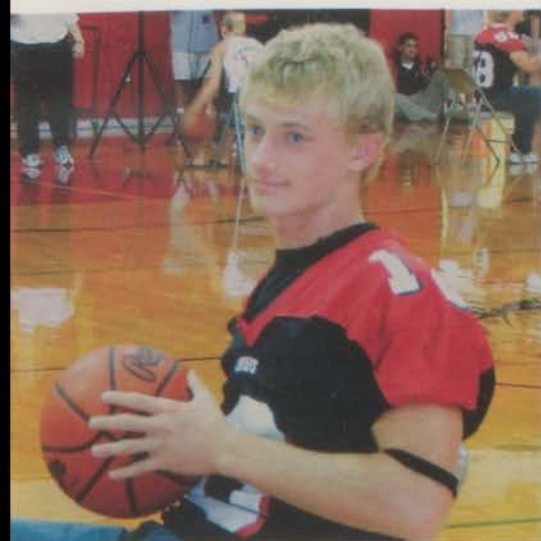

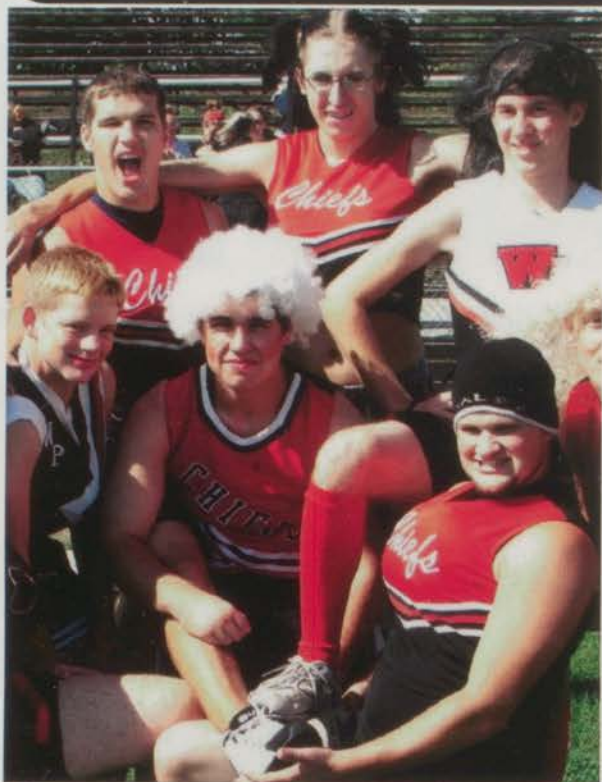

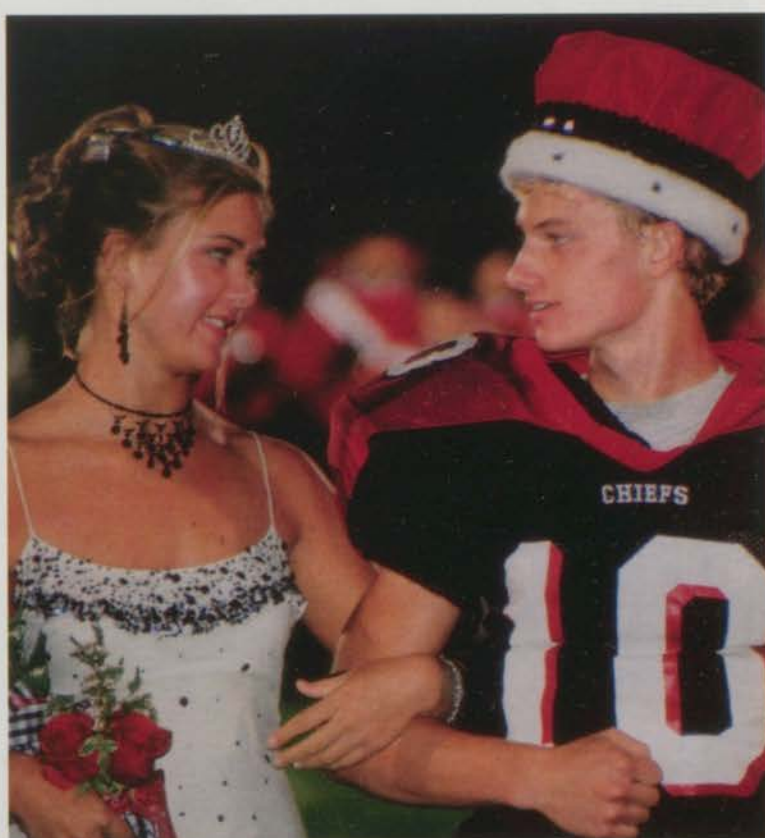
From Beginning To End Seniors Dominated This Game!!!

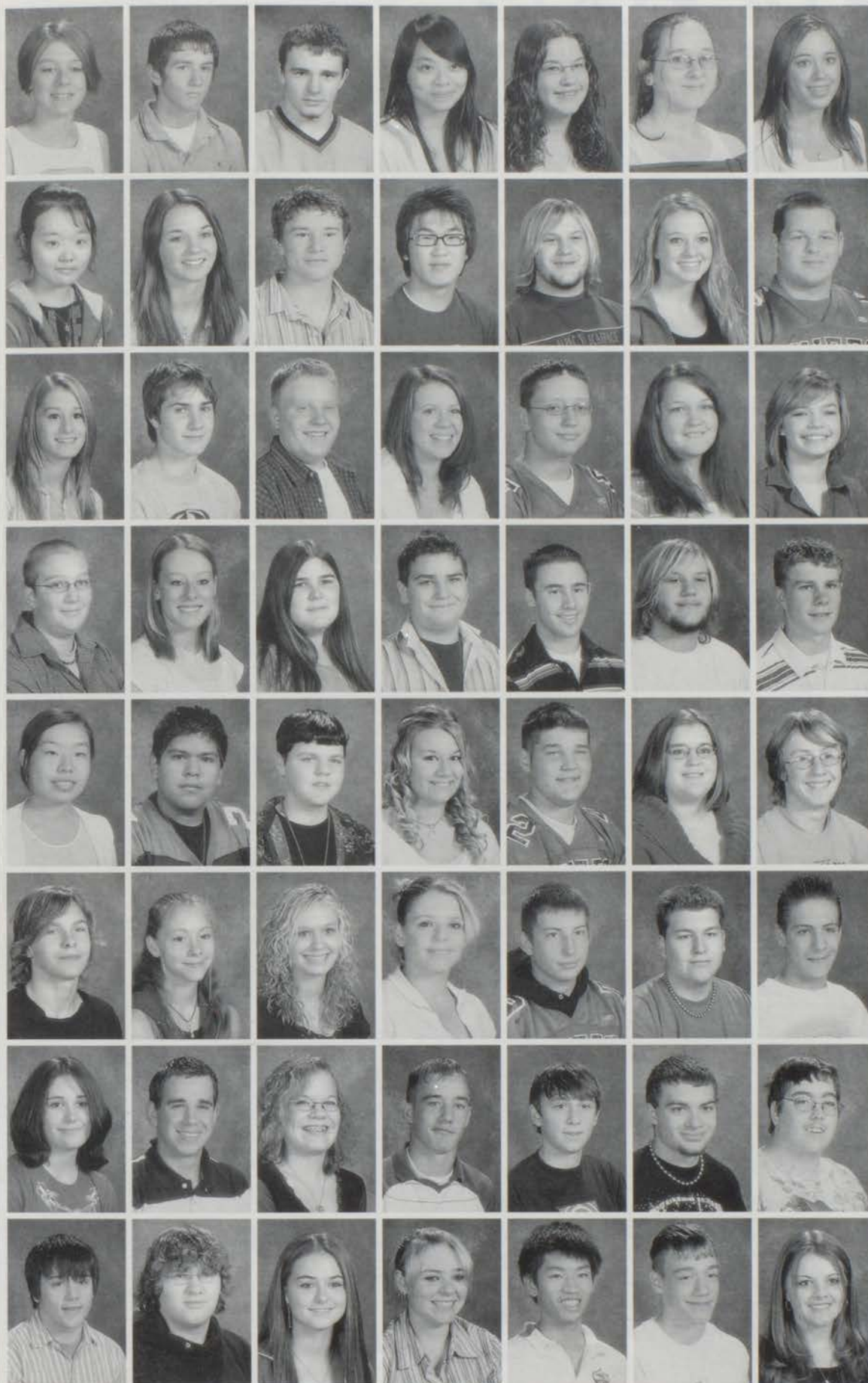

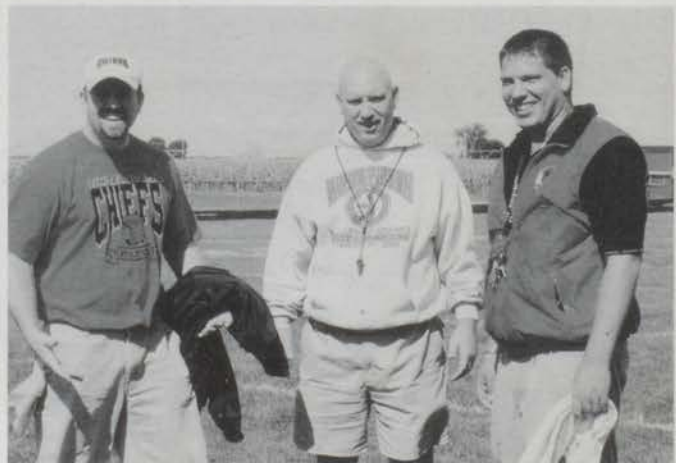

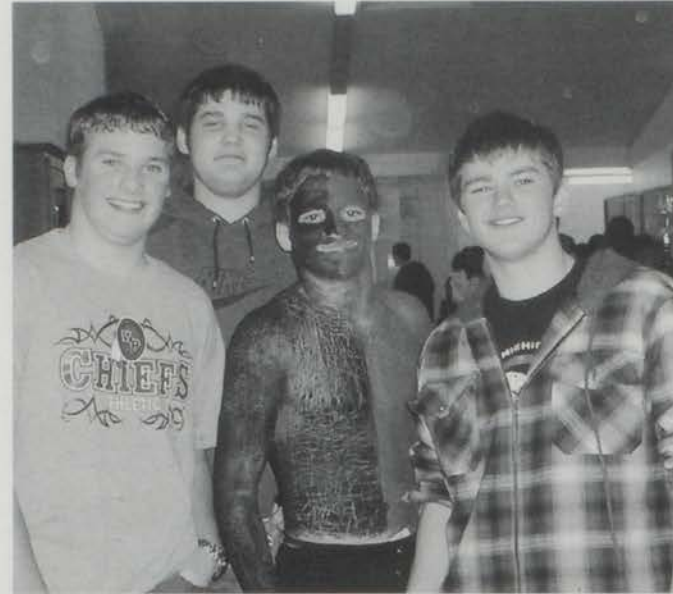

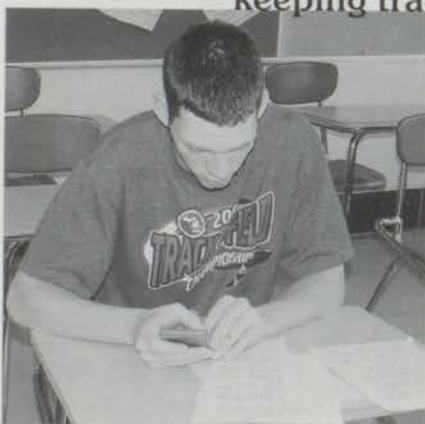

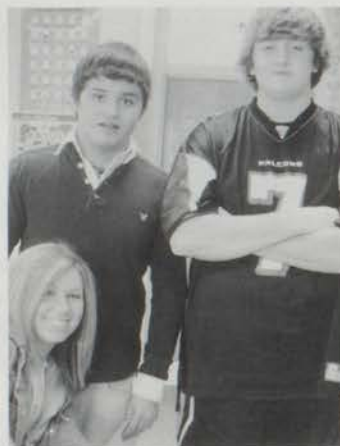

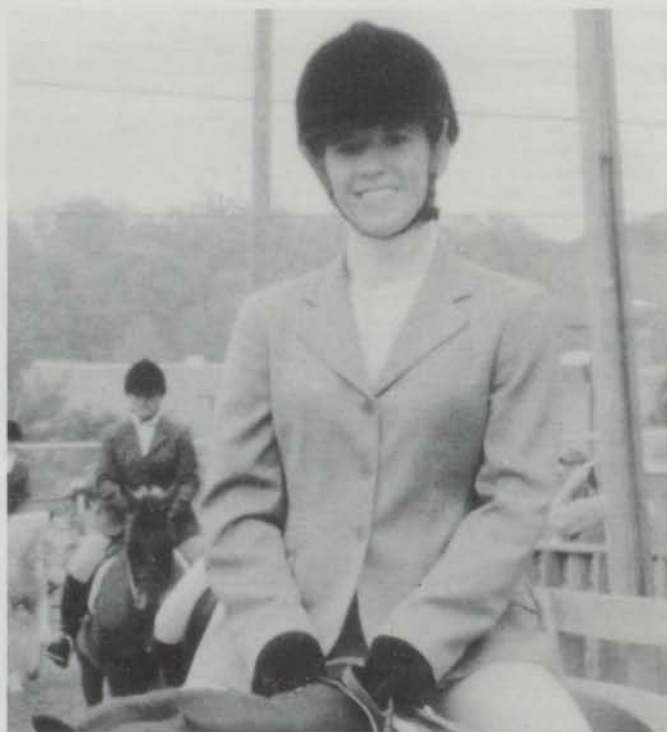

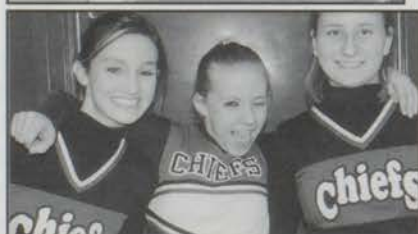

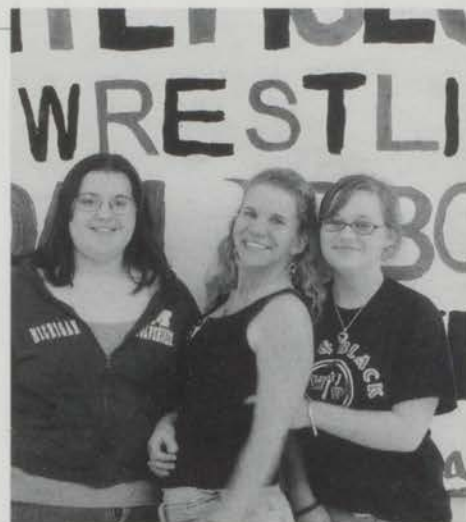

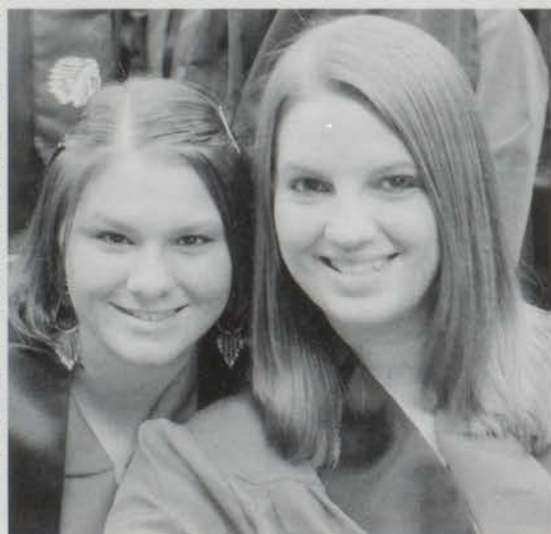

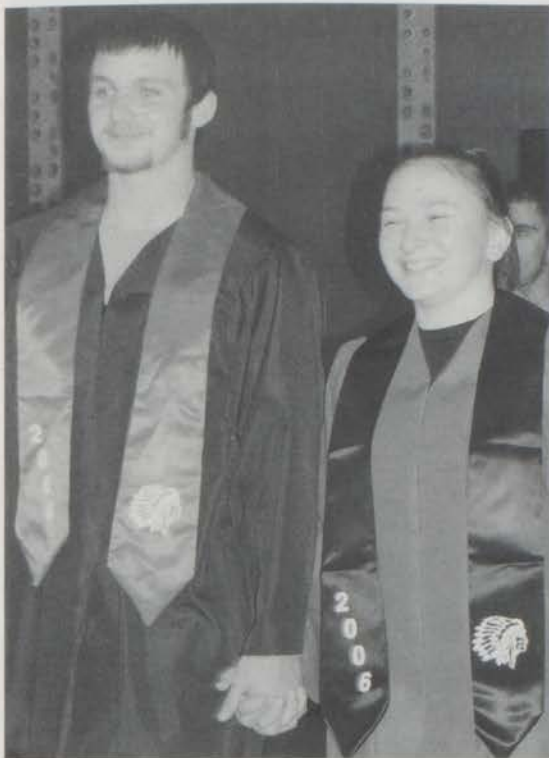

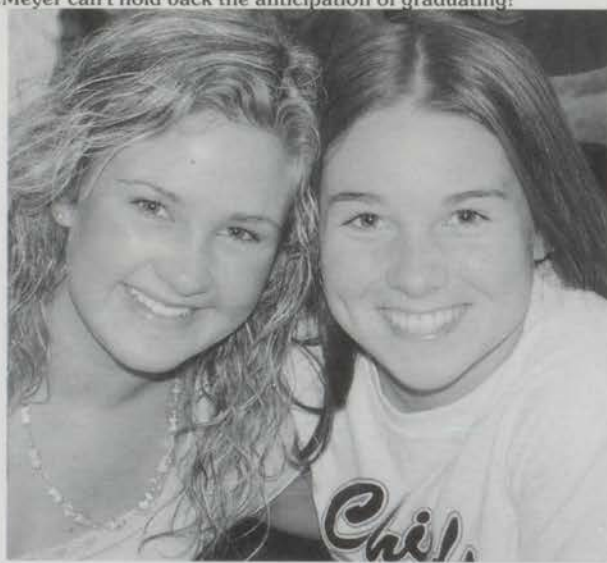

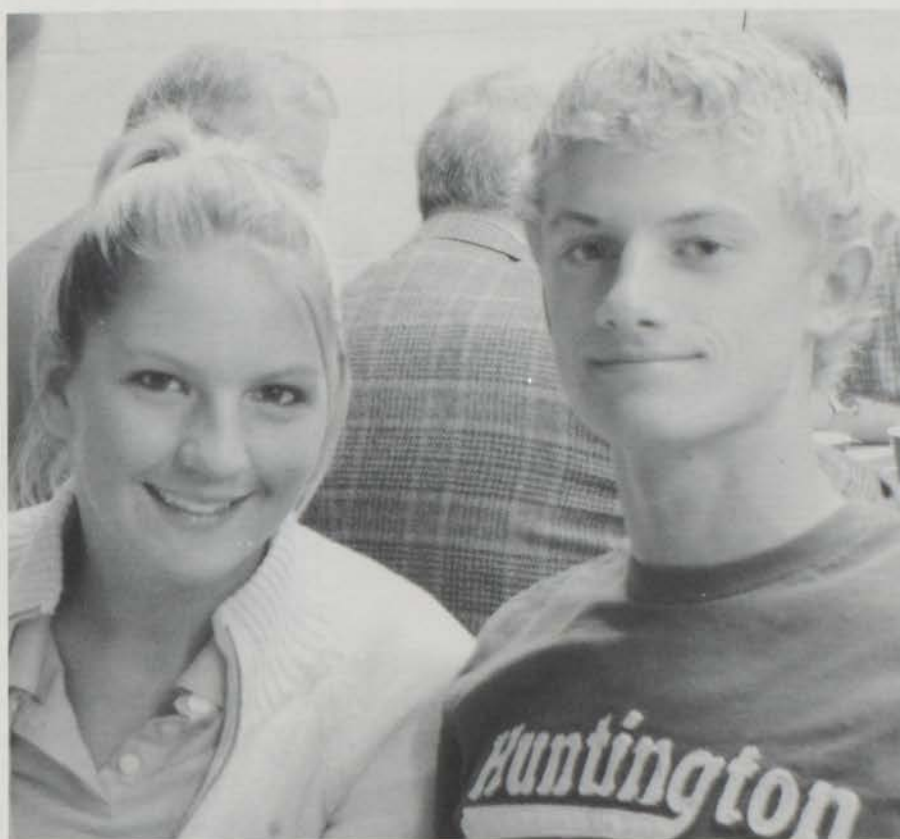
