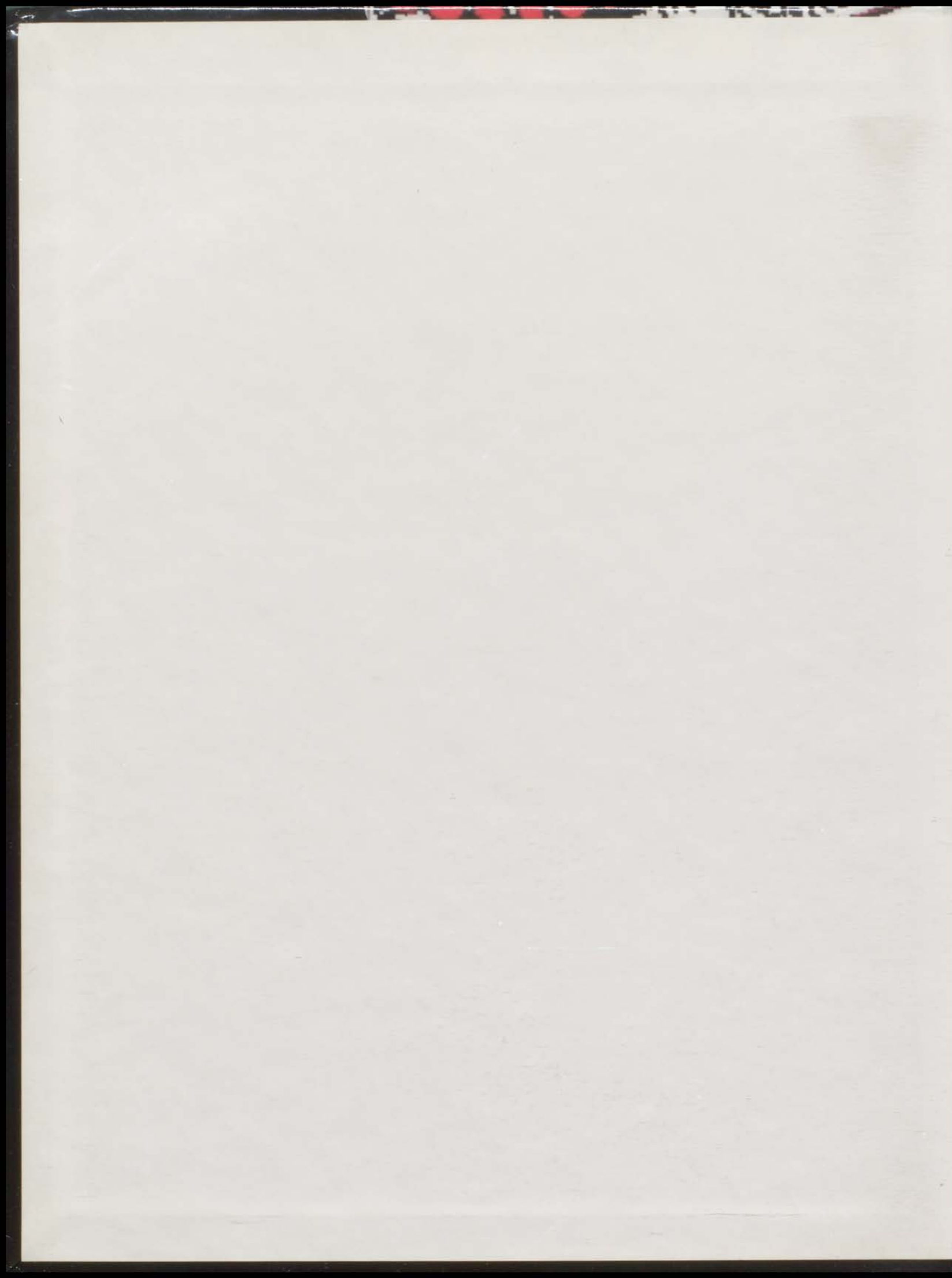

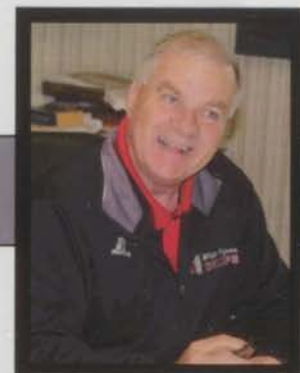
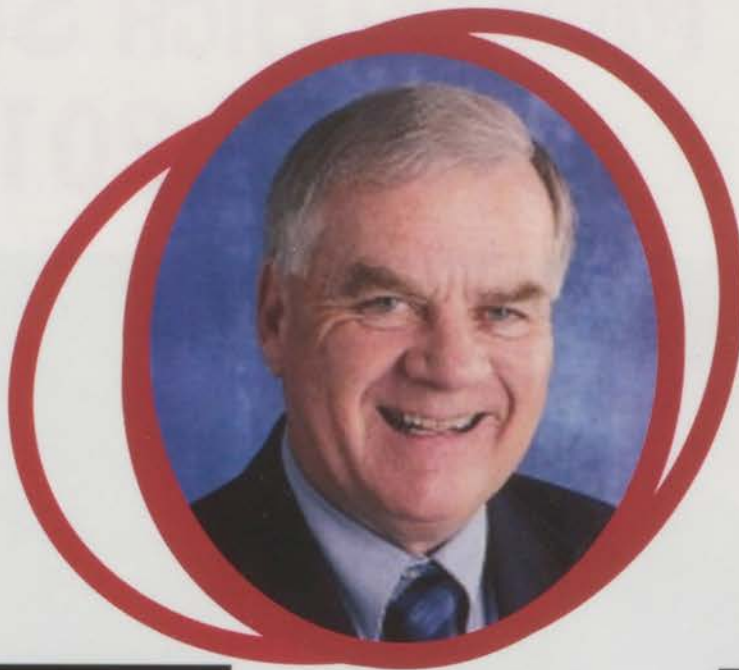
# Thank You Mr. West!

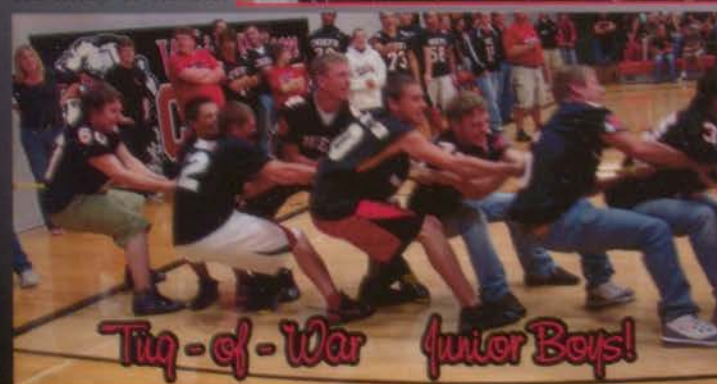

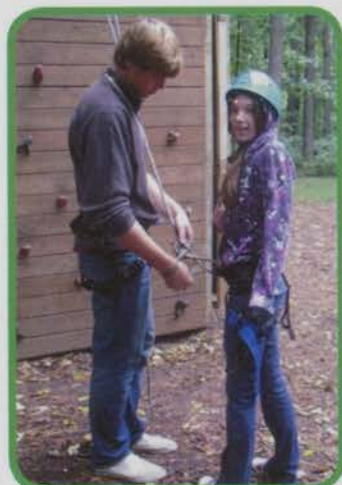

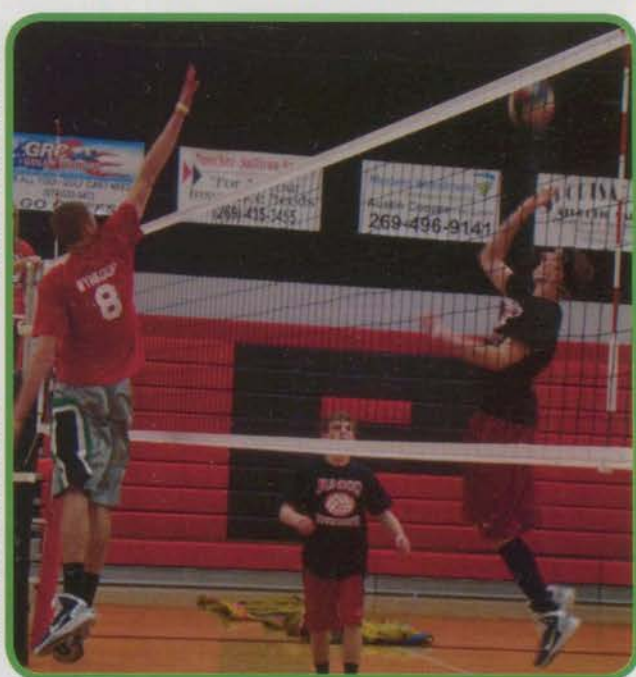

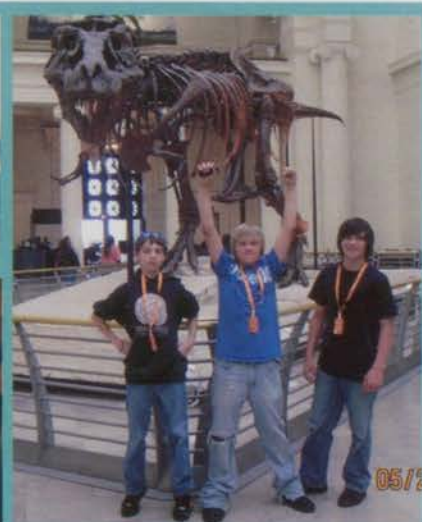

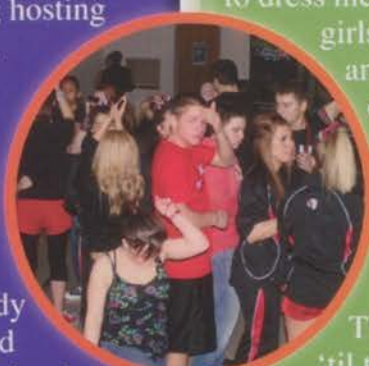

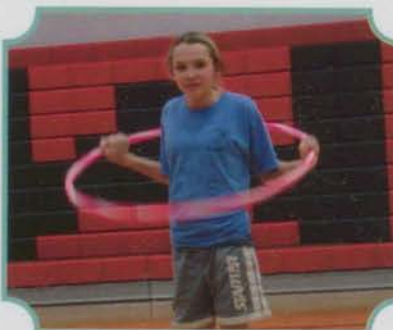

## College Visitation

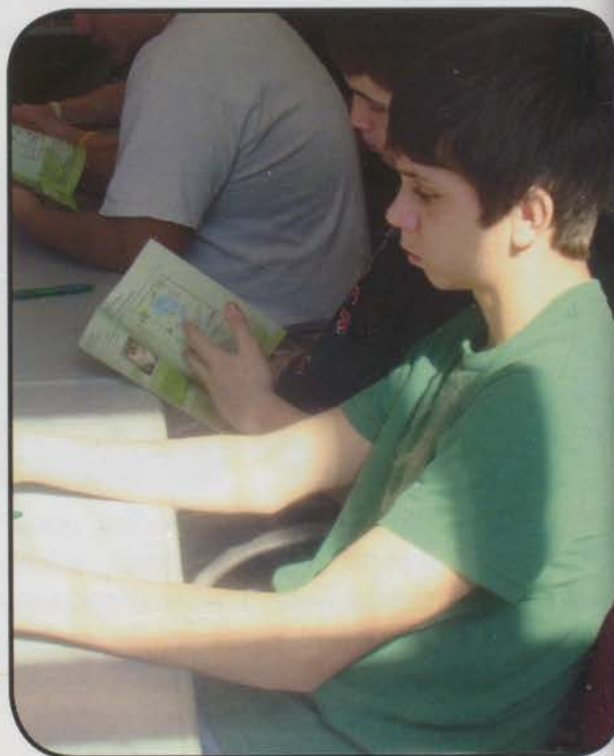

The 1st Place selection from each school is sent to ALA District #4 for judging, and the top winner from the District level goes to the state ALA.

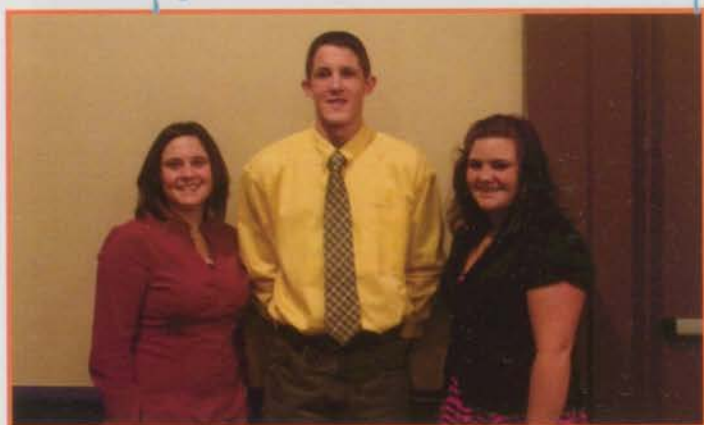


## 6th Grade Clue-Me-In

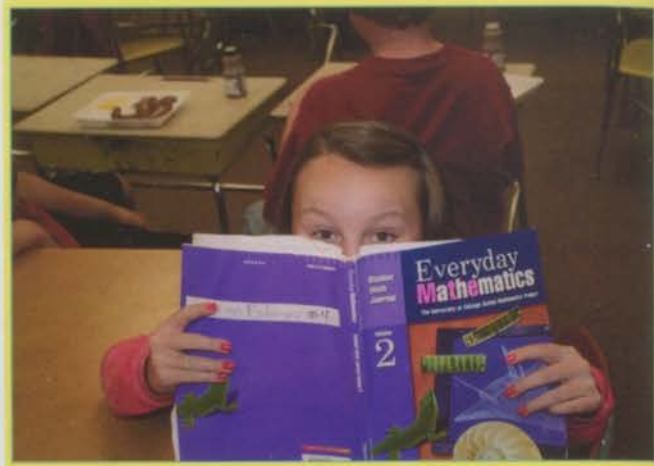

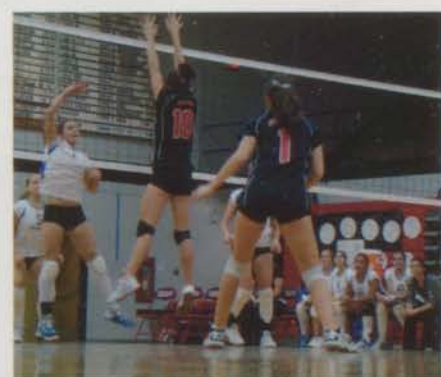

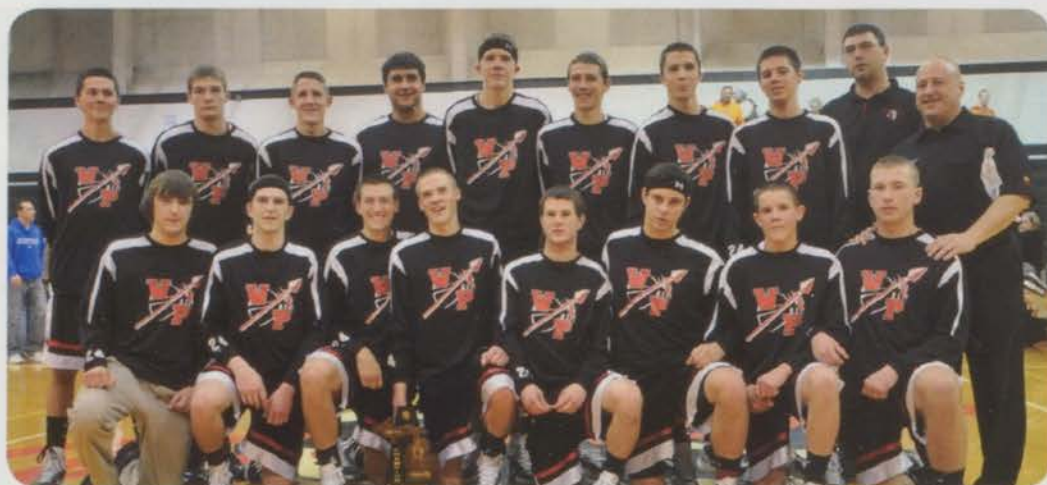
