

## Thank You Mr. West!


-This book is dedicated to Mr. Patrick West for his years of service to White Pigeon Schools-


The students and staff would like to wish Mr. West the best of luck in his retirement. Thank you very much for your years of service to our students, our school, and our community.






The 1st Place selection from each school is sent to ALA District #4 for judging, and the top winner from the District level goes to the state ALA.




